Remembering Atara ע"ה:

Armed with Neshek, the Talmidos will distribute Shabbos candles and educate as many people as they can reach to perform this beautiful Mitzvah and thereby spreading Atara's light throughout the city and bringing Moshiach closer. The first two תורה ו פרשיות share an essential connection, as both pertain to the creation and existence of the world. בראשית, read last week, describes the actual creation, while in ח, this week's Parsha, ה' promises that He will sustain the world and never bring another מבול

Symbolically, these two פרשיות represent two different levels of the perfection of creation.

בראשית represents the world's perfection as it is created by 'a without man's input or interaction. הז represents a level of perfection that can only be attained by man's efforts, i.e., the עבודת . From the perspective of the first level, there is no possibility for disobeying 'as will. Were man to disobey 'a he would automatically lose his right to exist. This is indeed what occurred at the end of last week's שיש when 'a" saw that the evil of man was great... and 'a said, 'I will destroy the man whom I have created.'

This week, however, we see that man has been given the power to refine himself, and to reach an even higher level of perfection than before his sin. This ability is alluded to by the rainbow, symbolic of 'as covenant with נו and 'as great joy when His children bring the world to even higher levels of perfection through their own actions. This concept is also reflected in the Names of 'a that are used to describe the act of creation and in regard to נו According to the מור, the world was created by 'a using the Name "אלקים"; likewise, "אלקים" is used an additional 32 times in reference to creation. The Name used in reference to n however, is the ineffable name of 'a that cannot be pronounced.

אלקים which הטבע אלקים גמטריא has the same אלקים אלקים that is limited, represents a level of קדושה that is limited, whereas 'ns ineffable name represents a level above all limitations. We learn from this that the world, as it was created and without man's contribution, has the potential for only a limited revelation of 'n it is solely through the service of man that the higher, infinite and unlimited revelation of 'n is achieved. This idea is further expressed by the months in which these are read.

is read in רשרי the month of בראשית; moreover, at least some of the days corresponding to the week in which ובראשית read are themselves ימים טובים.

Noach however, is read in the month of ματημ, all of whose weekdays are ordinary days. For as symbolized by μ, man's essential task in this world is to elevate even the most mundane aspects of life and reveal the unlimited potential for a contained therein.



<u>Tip of the Week</u> <u>Turn Setbacks into Stepping Stones</u>

Setbacks are part of the learning process. Reminding your daughter that one small setback shouldn't disrupt her whole day, week, or school term is an important life lesson. It's one data point. Challenges are simply opportunities in disguise. A bad grade or a missing assignment doesn't define their next step.
