In this week's פרשה, we read about יוֹסף's two children, Menasheh and Efrayim. These names are full of meaning: Menasheh - "`ה made me forget all my hardships and my father's home"; Efrayim - "ה" made me fruitful in the land of my suffering."

קט" was well aware that 'ה had brought him down to Egypt to affect Egypt in a positive and G-dly way. At the same time, however, קטי needed to insure that he would not lose his unique identity, something that is a very possible result of mingling in a foreign culture.

The names of איוי's sons addressed these sentiments. Menasheh refers to connecting with his past; although יוסף talks about forgetting, he is referring to the anguish he suffered, not his אידישע way of life and the תורה he had studied. Efrayim, to be fruitful in the land of his suffering, speaks of the importance of involving himself with and affecting Egypt.

What lesson can we take from מוסף? Why did he name his first son "Menasheh"? And how does this connect to Chanuka?

 $\eta$ סי sets the standard for all אידן of all times. We are יוסף! We are meant to affect the world around us by participating in and influencing our surroundings with Torah values. It is obvious that this is true, because ` $\dot{\alpha}$  put us here in a physical world.

The challenge is to influence but not be influenced, especially when we find success. This is why Menasheh comes first. In order to be effective and not be swept away, we must constantly develop and strengthen our essential bond and foundation in אידישקייט. This needs to come first, if we want to be effective in our mission to change the world in a positive way.

In the story of Chanuka, many if not most of the אידן succumbed to the licentious lifestyle of the Greeks. They lost their way, and sense of moral superiority, their connection to קדושה and המכבים. The מכבים, outnumbered and weak, saved the day and saved were true to 'אידישקייט. Not because they were great warriors, but because they were true to 'ה and His תורה. When you are on 'ה's side you will ultimately be victorious.

Today, we again find ourselves in a world of lies and confusion. Decency, morality and truth are in decay. At this time we must strengthen our essential foundation. We must, like the Maccabees, stand strong for what we know to be the truth and the highest standard of living, the תווה way.

May we soon dedicate our בית המקדש again.

### The Joys of Being a Step Ahead

Even on days with little or no homework, proactive students understand that there's always something they can do to set themselves up for success in the coming days and weeks. While a reactive student tends to navigate day-to-day, sometimes struggling to catch up, a proactive student finds ways to stay a step ahead, cultivating a sense of control over their academic and personal lives. They engage their executive function skills and break down assignments into manageable tasks. They do this by initiating less preferred tasks in advance, maintaining strong organizational systems, planning ahead, and creating buffers that offer opportunities for flexibility when needed.

Below are some examples of proactive steps students can take to stay a step or two ahead. What would your daughter put on her list to become a more proactive student?

- Tidy and organize my physical workspace
- Organize digital files into file folders
- Clean out my backpack and file papers into dividers in my binder or folders
- Rewrite notes in my own words to solidify understanding
- Identify long-term assignments and break them down into component parts and set deadlines to complete each component
- Search for and create a plan to complete missing work
- Gather resources and begin to create study guides for upcoming tests
