כי תבוא

This week's כי תבא, פרשה, opens with the ביכורים of - first fruits. "You shall put it in a basket...and the שוו will take the basket out of your hand."

Closer study of the מתורה's laws of ביכורים reveals that the presentation of the basket (usually made out of wicker) to the מצוה was an integral part of the מצוה itself.

Interestingly, while the fruits that were brought were only the choicest (and only selected from the שבעת המינים), the basket that was used for them was made of a common material.

This seeming contradiction in the מצוה of ביכורים contains an allusion to the descent of the נשמה from the higher worlds and its incarnation in a physical body down below.

The fruits of the ביכורים are symbolic of the נשמה; the basket is the גוף. Handing the basket to the כהן represents the purpose for which the נשמה made this drastic descent.

In general, the first fruits are symbolic of the אידן; more specifically, of the נשמה as it exists Above, completely transcendent of the physical world.

'a's plan, however, is for this lofty נשמה to become enclothed in a body, a coarse and lowly "vessel" which contains it, as it were.

This vessel makes it difficult for the נשמה to express its connection with 'ה, even to the point of obscuring its true mission in the world. Again, just as in the מצוה of ביכורים, the holy and superior "fruit" is contained and even constrained within the confines of a simple and unpretentious "basket."

חסידות provides the reason for this, explaining that the descent of the נשמה into a physical body is a " ירידה צורך "עלי": It is precisely through its sojourn on the physical plane, having to confront the difficulties of this world and overcome them, that the essence of the נשמה is revealed and a higher level of spirituality attained - much higher than could ever be reached without experiencing this descent in the first place.

In principle, "fruits" alone are not enough; the objective of the נשמה's descent is "fruits within a basket."

The נשמה's ascent is accomplished through the performance of practical מצוות, which can only be done with the help of the "vessel" - the physical body. For in truth, the נשמה was already filled with love and awe of 'ה before it came into the material world; the only change it experiences upon finding itself in a body is that it can now do physical מצוות, something that was previously impossible. Thus the נשמה is rendered capable of elevating the physical world and turning it into קדושה the very intent of all of creation.
